I am somewhat conflicted as I have historically been a strong advocate for the age restrictions to be removed, however given the current context including pending workforce issues (DT retirement) and having the workforce to provide the care and who want work in DHB or community focused providers, but also the level of skills that I am seeing via either employing OHT's or supporting them with placement while studying, is ever decreasing in abilities – I do not think it would safe or wise for this to go ahead for either the public or the profession... at this stage.

The dual scope qualification has already impacted negatively (in my view) on the workforce availability (e.g. OHT's not wanting to work in DHB or in private practice as an OHT instead preferring to work just as a hygienist to maximise their own income first over learning how to provide effective and appropriate care for our community). Additionally they have expectations (salary and opportunity) which are often more appropriate for an experienced competent clinician not a new or recent grad who is still working through the normal process of becoming a competent experienced clinician.
