I wish to state for the record that public safety is being put at risk, as there is an aging population with increasingly complex medical and health issues faced by our us while treating patients. I do not think that the OHT training programme provides enough to diagnose, and treat patients across a vast medical spectrum as proposed. Adult restorative care can be staggeringly difficult and poorly trained second-tier dental providers will be overwhelmed by the complexities of providing care to low-income adults with unrealistic expectations and poor oral health. The short OHT training programme does not allow enough time to comprehensively learn about all of the treatment options required to perform dentistry, nor the complications of dental procedures that we manage on a routine basis.

Overall oral health and affordability of dentistry could be improved by removing GST from dentistry, and taxing high sugary and acidic drinks. Focusing on these key aspects would be a better way of tackling the above issue and improving the standard of care for dental patients in New Zealand.
