This appears to be a deeply divisive issue mostly along the specific interests of varying health professional groups, professional bodies and institutions. The consultation document does not in my opinion provide any real assurance that the public safety will be enhanced by the adoption of the proposal, nor is there any compelling evidence that it will result in either improved access, reduced costs or effective management of what is wrongly considered to be a group of adult patients with low complexity needs. There is insufficient evidence to support a belief that there are likely to be robust and meaningful training programmes and meaningful relationships within "teams". Furthermore there is very limited consideration (or evidence presented) as to the impact that this may or may not have on the workforce available to manage the at least historical raison d'etre for therapy practice the primary care management of children and adolescents in New Zealand.

I would look forward to reconsidering my view if a document were offered that specifically addresses my concerns. I urge the Counci to delay a decision on this matter until a wider development process is undertaken engaging with all stakeholder groups.
