Hospital Dental has been able to closely observe how newly graduated dentists cope once exposed to a working environment and the over whelming observation we have is they need a great deal of support. Therefore we only support extended scope in a supportive team framework.

One of the reasons implied for the change of scope is that it will make dentistry more affordable. Working in a hospital providing low cost dentistry it is evident every day this is not low complexity, the social and medical co-morbidity's evident in this group require management and diagnostic skills beyond the scope of a 3 year degree.

Associated with cost of dentistry, the costs of running a dental practice are around 60%, therefore the ability of an independent therapist to provide dentistry at a lower price point is far from guaranteed.

Lastly our Community Dental services struggle to attract and maintain their work force, this change will only mean a service already struggling to meet demand will be further disadvantaged.
