Education for Adult Care, including restorations, are specifically taught and trained in dental students. Oral health therapist act only as auxiliaries to the dental profession, and in this way do not have sufficient training or scope of knowledge for for advanced adult care such as restorative activities. There is significant concern with the quality of dental care that will be effected should this restriction be removed. Protective, non-invasive, and non-restorative procedures may be bypassed for the sake of conducting restorative procedures by Oral Health Therapist, as they do not have the scope of knowledge or training to conduct more advanced and non-invasive procedures that will be required for proper patient care.
