Accessibility to dental care is a growing issue for New Zealanders, particularly for those in rural areas. Removal of the age restriction will hopefully help to improve accessibility and encourage for restructuring of the current dental system.

OHTs undergo training on both primary and permanent dentition. This allows OHTs to develop the skills and competency in treating children and adults. The curriculum covers pharmacology, medical conditions, and dental anatomy.

Dental complications and concerns can be minimised through a consultative professional relationship between OHTs and dentists. By collaborating together, we can provide better care for our patients. Patient safety and their health needs is always a priority. Where needed, OHTs can refer appropriately to a dentist when complex restorative care is needed. Additionally, dentists can delegate suitable patients to an OHT for treatment. Dentists can also benefit from the removal of the age restriction as they can have more time for more complex restorative treatment.

It is our professional and ethical responsibility to practice within our scope. Therefore, there should be no concerns that OHTs will want to do things outside of our scope such as RCTs.
