Prescribed qualifications for the scope of practice for clinical dental technology

#### New Zealand accredited programme

• Registration in the dental technology scope of practice and a Postgraduate Diploma in Clinical Dental Technology University of Otago.

# **Competent Authority- Qualification**

#### Australia

- an educational institution dental prosthetics qualification accredited by the Australian Dental Council<sup>1</sup>.
- an Australian educational institution qualification approved by the Dental Board of Australia for the purposes of registration in dental prosthetics in Australia<sup>2</sup>.

# Competent Authority- Registration<sup>3</sup>

- current full/unrestricted/unconditional clinical dental technology or equivalent registration with a competent authority(s) recognised by Council<sup>4</sup>; and
- clinical practice<sup>5</sup> in clinical dental technology in the recognised competent authority(s) for at least 33 months (working 20 hours or more per week) during the 48 months prior to application.

#### **Examination**

• A clinical dental technology qualification and a pass in the New Zealand Clinical Dental Technology Registration Examination.

# Prescribed qualifications for implant overdentures

- Until 1 July 2017 registration as a Clinical Dental Technician plus evidence of appropriate
  training, completion or commencement of at least 8 documented cases and a competency
  attestation from an appropriately qualified dentist or dental specialist
- A Dental Council approved implant overdenture course or a pass in the Dental Council implant overdenture registration examination.
