



## Disciplinary levy – reminder to pay by **20th November**

In August 2025, the Council prescribed an additional disciplinary levy for practitioners holding an APC in the dentistry, oral health therapy, dental hygiene, and dental therapy professions. The levy was necessary to meet increased costs due to a significant rise in professional conduct cases across these oral health professions.

Invoices for the levy were issued on 20 October, and the Council takes this opportunity to remind practitioners who haven't yet paid that this is due by 20 November 2025. If you have difficulties paying, please approach our team for time payment options.


### Ensuring compliance: Practice Standards Audits
